
## A Living Landscape

Table Mountain was once an Iron-Age hill fort and the people who built it were called Celts. The Celts were farmers but their farms were not as big as the farms you will have seen today. The landscape is always changing; as some things disappear others will take their place.


Gwern-y-Bwtler, the farm you walked through today, is a mixed farm which means the farmer has different types of animals and grows some crops, mainly to feed his animals.

Did you know? The Welsh name for Table Mountain is Crug Hywel, which means Hywel's mound. The town below it is now called Crickhowell.


There is not much evidence of the Celtic buildings that were in the hill fort. Remember it was about three thousand years ago and the materials they used were all natural and would rot away.

Did you know? Welsh Place names that begin with Llan are named after Saints and were probably named by the early Christian Hermits. Llanbedr means the holy ground of Saint Peter and Llangenny means the holy ground of Saint Cenau.
