Thanks to the generosity and continued support of the Friends group, we continue to subsidise evening visits from our resident storyteller, Daniel Morden, provide cameras and DVDs for pupils to take home pictures from their stay, supply the greenhouse and garden with seeds and growbags to enable pupils to learn about where their food comes from, refresh and update the displays around Pendarren and provide new games for the Common Room and grounds. We have brand new displays in the Annexe and a themed series of pictures in the House and have also set up a bird feeding station on the lawn and a rockpool aquarium in the hall...look out for them next time you visit!

### Gardening

To deliver these courses, Pendarren makes full use of its location and groups have the opportunity to explore and undertake challenges in the natural environment of the Brecon Beacons, which includes rock faces, caves, rivers, waterfalls, mountains, forests and the beaches and cliffs of the Gower. In addition to these natural resources the 16 acre site includes a climbing and abseil tower, high and low ropes courses, orienteering courses and many other on-site activities.

I am writing to tell you how terrific the trip was and how much it helped me find some independence inside myself. Alice


It helped me become more independent. (It also taught me how to make my bed!) Brady

They grow emotionally, socially and academically over their stay; guided by instructors that are professional in their knowledge and understanding of the needs of city children. The staff quickly get to know individual personalities and they are encouraged to challenge themselves in ways they have never dreamed of, work together and play together, support each other and become closer as a year group."
